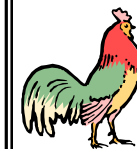
## HAITI UPDATE

We welcome Deacon Anita Thorstad home after her seven weeks in Ste. Marie Madeleine, Bondeau, Haiti. The project is blessed to have her wonderful ministry at this time of extreme need in Haiti.

Two new projects are underway in Bondeau. A building that will provide housing for four families is being constructed on the Parish property as a model. Although Bondeau did not lose housing in the earthquake, many people from damaged areas have relocated to Bondeau, which has no available housing. If this first building is a success, funding will be raised for additional buildings.

The second project is the beginning of a trade school in Bondeau. Over one hundred registered for the program before registration was cut off due to the large number interested. Pere Kesner Garcia will soon visit Florida to discuss Bondeau planning for the next few years. The project will also soon announce Mission trip possibilities for this year.
