**Bishop Leo Frade's Prayer Request for Oil Spill**

I urge you to include in all your regular worship services prayers for the fragile ecosystems around us and specifically for this present threat to our environment. You may want to use this prayer, adapted from the Prayer for conservation of Natural Resources (BCP, p. 827) by the Rev. Canon Beverly Gibson, sub-dean of Christ Church Cathedral, Mobile, Ala.:

*We pray today for the preservation of our natural environment, especially the Gulf of Mexico and the lands and waters it touches: Guide those who labor to contain the oil that endangers the creatures of sea and land; strengthen those who work to protect them; have mercy on those whose livelihoods will suffer; forgive us for our carelessness in using the resources of nature, and give us wisdom and reverence so to manage them in the future, that no one may suffer from our abuse of them, and that generations yet to come may continue to praise you for your bounty; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen*

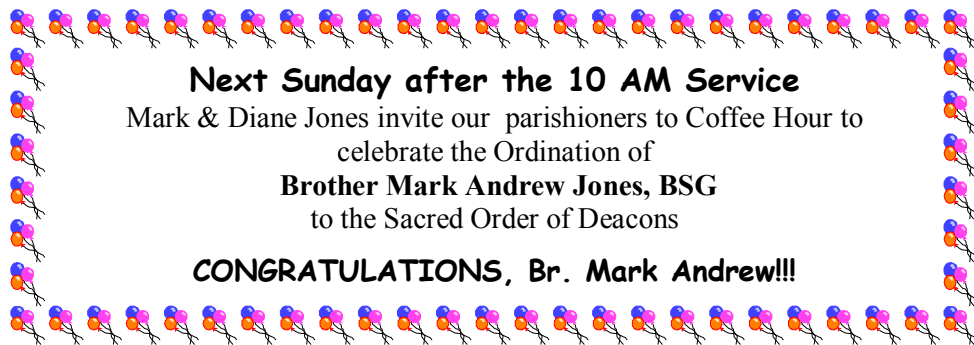

## HAITI UPDATE

Fr. Kesner Gracia, priest in charge at Ste. Marie Madeleine Parish at Bondeau, recently spent eight days in Boca Raton where he reunited with his wife Anne and daughter Kestie for the first time since shortly after the earthquake. Fr. Kesner met with the Diocesan Haiti Relief Task Force, visited All Saints Ft. Lauderdale, St. Agnes, Miami, and St. Paul's, Delray as well as St. Gregory's. While at Historic St. Agnes, the Project received checks from St. Agnes, the Assoc. of Parishes around St. Agnes, and Men's Group number one from St. Agnes totaling nearly \$31,000, from their Lenten offering. Fr. Kesner reported on the recovery in Haiti and delivered a report on Bondeau developments including the start of a Trade School, completion of a fourplex housing unit, latrine and showers, development of a goat farm and expanded feeding programs. He thanked all for the support of the Bondeau mission and asked for continued support of the people with prayer, advocating for the Haitian people and with continued financial support. The SFHP Executive Committee, with Fr. Kesner's participation, has begun discussion to expand housing units, build a trade school and a church for worship services.

Deacon Anita Thorstad is currently leading a mission group of 12 people in Bondeau from St. Paul's Delray, St. David's in Wayne, Pa., and St. Gregory's. They will return June 1. Please keep them in your prayers.

Another group will go to Bondeau July 22 to 26. The mission includes a gala Ste. Marie Madeleine Day celebration, graduation of the first class at the Trade School, and eight marriage ceremonies. Ten places are still available for this trip. If interested, contact Deacon Anita Thorstad. Applications are due June 29, along with a \$100 deposit.
